Some information about the subject selection



IPS syllabus consists of 5 compulsory subjects which consists of two subjects of general studies , One for qualifying English and one for Essay. Candidates have to choose two optional subjects from a list of 25 subjects. Some combinations are not allowed in the UPSC syllabus which is described as follows:-

1. Political Science and International relations and public relations
2. Anthropology and sociology
3. Commerce, **Accountancy** and management
4. Mathematics and statistics
5. Management and public administration
6. Agricultural and animal husbandry
7. **Medical science** and animal husbandry and veterinary science
- 8 Any two branches of engineering
9. Combination of two literatures

Eligibility and sectional marking



For sitting and qualifying for the exam UPSC has made some eligibility criteria s. They are discussed in details as follows:-

1. He/ She must be an **Indian** Citizen.
2. The student must not have attained the age of 30 years for the general category students. For the OBC or other backward caste candidates the age limit is up to 36 years. For the schedule caste and schedule tribes the age limit is extended up to 37 years.

Section I- For the first section candidate have to select one language from the list of 22 languages and this section consists of 300 marks

Section II- **English** language as a qualifying paper and it carries 300 marks

Section III- Essay in the medium you choose and it carries 200 marks

Section IV & V- General studies which consists of 600 marks. Mainly each section carries 300 marks

Section VI, VII, VIII and IX - In these sections any two subjects are to be selected and each of them carries 300 marks each. So it carries total marks of 1200 marks.

So the total marks for the written examination is 2000 marks

Interview round consists of 300 marks. So the grand total marks is 2300.
